



### Health expenditure in 2000–2019, at 2019 prices, EUR million






### Structure of health expenditure in 2019, %






## Long-term care for older people and disabled and home care in 2000–2019, at 2019 prices, EUR million






# Expenditure on medicines and other medical consumables in 2000–2019, at 2019 prices, EUR million






#### Health expenditure financing in 2000 - 2019, %






## Health care expenditure as a proportion of GDP in the Nordic and OECD countries in 2000–2019, %

#### Health Expenditure and Financing in 2019

- Finland's health expenditure amounted to EUR 22.0 billion in 2019. Compared to the previous year, the health care expenditure increased by 3.0 per cent in real terms. The per capita expenditure was EUR 3,983.
- The health expenditure corresponded to 9.2 per cent of GDP in 2019, which was 0.2 percentage points more than the year before.
- Expenditure on specialised medical care (EUR 8.0 billion) and primary health care (EUR 3.4 billion) accounted for over one half of the health expenditure in 2019.
- Expenditure on prescription medicines in outpatient care (EUR 2.3 billion) increased by 10.1 per cent in real terms compared to the previous year
- Long-term and home care expenditure for the elderly and persons with disabilities more than doubled in real terms (+113.6%) between 2000 and 2019. Over the same period, health care expenditure as a whole increased by 61.2% in real terms.
- In 2019, public funding accounted for 76.8 per cent and private funding for 23.2 per cent of the health expenditure. The share of public funding increased by 0.8 percentage points year-on-year.
